The Autonomous status of the college allows us decentralization, in academic and administrative procedures and functions of the college. The institution is supported by the University Professors who are members of various committees like the Academic Council and Governing Body. The University Heads of departments are ex-officio members in the Boards of study. The Governance of the college rests with the Governing body nominated by the parent organization the Chairman and secretary are main functionaries.

The Principal works in the day to day administration of the college with the guidance of the chairman and secretary and conducts various staff meetings related to academic admissions, examinations, internals, workshops, seminars, celebrations and periodically monitors the progress of implementation.

The **Academic Coordinator** looks after the academic issues like preparation and implementation of academic schedules like Almanac, provides guidance to students on academic goals and educational issues and monitors the activities under the guidance of principal and periodically checks the progress of implementation of Almanac and academic calendar.

Due to autonomy status of the college from 2007, The Exam branch was also established in the same year and is headed by the Controller of Examinations, who is a senior faculty member, along with three additional controllers representing three faculties. The College offers English and Second Language Courses like Telugu, Sanskrit Hindi, Arabic and French along with its Professional communicative English (2018-20) and Compulsory professional skills based courses from 2020 onwards and are referred as skill Enhancement courses and Ability Enhancement Compulsory courses. The department of Telugu encouraged writing skills of students and also published books written by students on poetry and short stories. With the collaboration of sister institutions of AMS, various Certificate courses related technology, Music, Media and dance are offered.

Certificate Courses are offered in Collaboration with sister institutions AMS Literacy House and few others are from AMS Fine Arts and Media Education. Details are given below.

Towards attainment of Holistic and multidisciplinary learning the College offers Courses like:

Environmental education (which includes Climate change, pollution, waste management, sanitation, conservation of biological diversity, management of biological resources and biodiversity. It covers activities of Eco Club, environmental awareness programmes, rallies Seminars. Collaborations and internships with environmental protection agencies EPTRI and Earthbox etc. Green audit and green initiative policies to monitor the progress.

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Value based Education: To inculcate values and spirit of Nationalism among the students, the College regularly conducts Students meetings in our Gandhi Bhavan meetings on Second Friday of every month. The College also celebrates Gandhi Jayanthi, Gandhi Vardhanti and Vivekananda Jayanthi. Human Values and Professional ethics is offered as an AECC Course which covers topics on universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa).

Life Skills are provided for Seva activities through National Service Scheme and Certified Voluntary Work. CVW was introduced as part of CBCS system in 2011-12 which covers activities on Shramdaan,, Supervision of College Campus, Library Maintenance, Service to old age homes and Hospitals and educating the children in Government Schools. The Students also volunteered in promoting the Vote Right of youth through street plays and slogans in 2022 as directed by the Election Commission. This year BBA(Healthcare Management) Apprenticeship embedded skill oriented program and BSc(Hon) program in Computer Science are introduced as a step to moving ahead with NEP- 2020.






