The Taksh Walk featured a variety of activities designed to engage participants and promote physical activity:

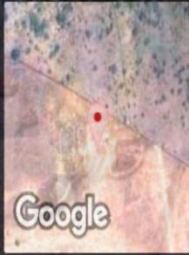
