



Interactive Sessions on Prevalent Social Issues: Poverty

Date: October 31, 2020

Venue: O.U. Conference Hall

Organized by: NSS Units of Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women

Objective: The Interactive Sessions on Prevalent Social Issues, focusing on poverty, aimed to raise awareness among NSS participants about the multifaceted aspects of poverty, its impact on society, and potential strategies for alleviation.

We extend our gratitude to all participants, facilitators, and organizers for their active involvement and commitment to addressing pressing social issues.



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Participation in Packing Food and Groceries for Needy Flood-Affected Areas of Chadhargat

Date: October 20, 2020

Location: Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women

On October 20, 2020, the NSS (National Service Scheme) units of Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women organized a humanitarian initiative to provide aid to the flood-affected areas of Chadhargat. The primary objective was to pack and distribute food and groceries to the needy families affected by the floods. Objective: The main goal of the activity was to extend a helping hand to the floodaffected communities in Chadhargat by providing essential supplies such as food and groceries. The initiative aimed to alleviate the suffering of the affected families and contribute to their recovery efforts.

Participants: Three NSS volunteers from Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women actively participated in the packing of food and groceries for the needy flood-affected areas of Chadhargat. The volunteers demonstrated enthusiasm and dedication throughout the activity.

Activities:

- Procurement of Supplies: The NSS units coordinated with local suppliers to procure food items and groceries required for packing. Essential items such as rice, pulses, cooking oil, sugar, salt, and other non-perishable goods were purchased.


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" Participation in Blood Donation Drive"

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

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
