Assistance to Dignitaries: A select group of volunteers provided assistance to dignitaries, escorting them to their designated seats, and catering to any special requirements they might have had.

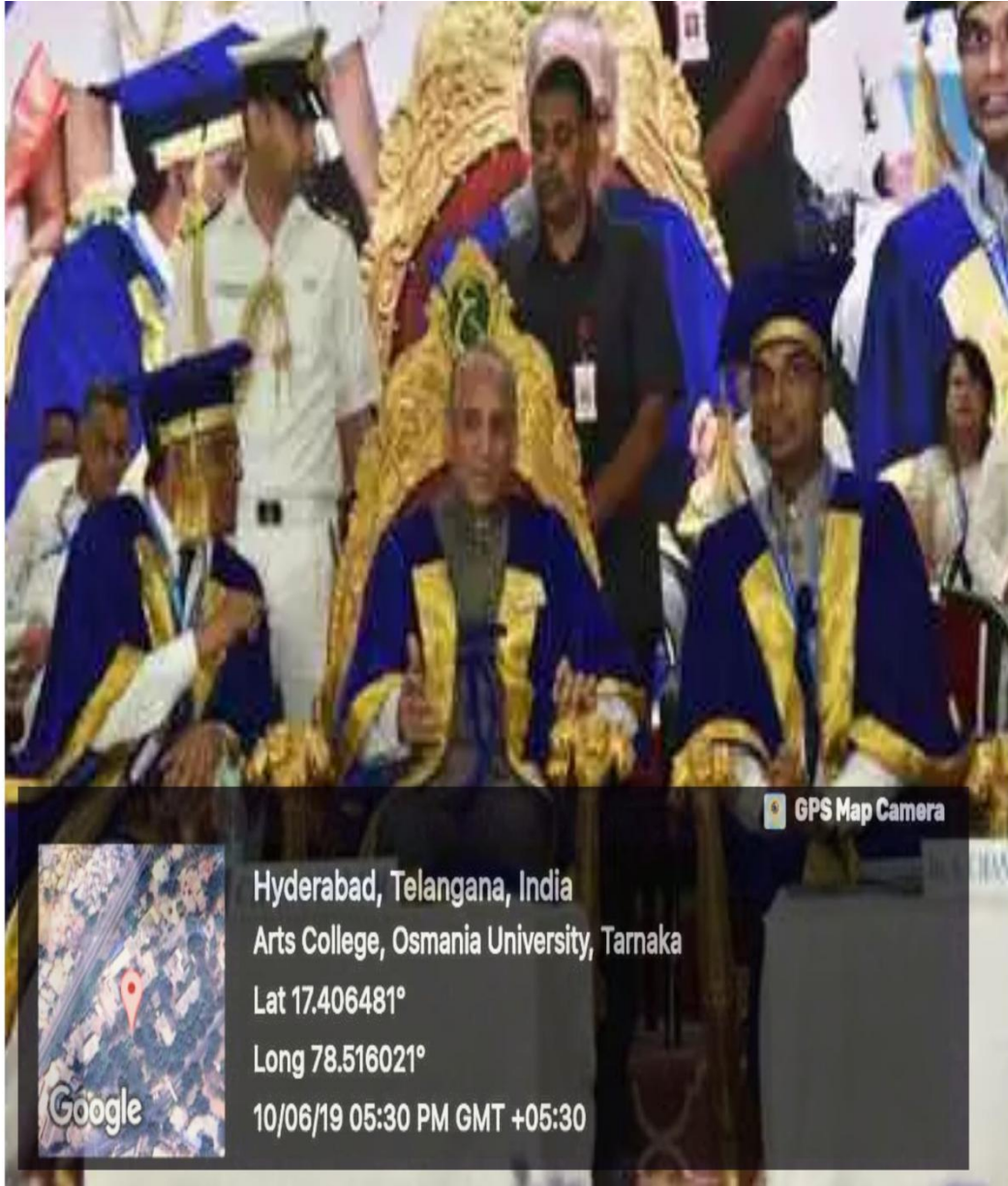

Their involvement in preparing posters and engaging in discussions contributed to the success of the event and helped spread awareness about HIV/AIDS among their peers and the community.

Conclusion: The Poster Presentation on HIV/AIDS organized by Andhra Mahila Sabha College of Arts and Science for Women was a successful initiative aimed at raising awareness about HIV/AIDS and promoting responsible behavior towards prevention and support. Through informative posters, interactive sessions, and community outreach efforts, the event succeeded in educating participants and fostering a supportive environment for those affected by HIV/AIDS.
