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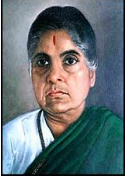


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A REPORT ON WOMEN PROPERTY RIGHTS IN INDIA

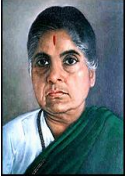

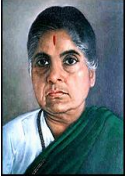

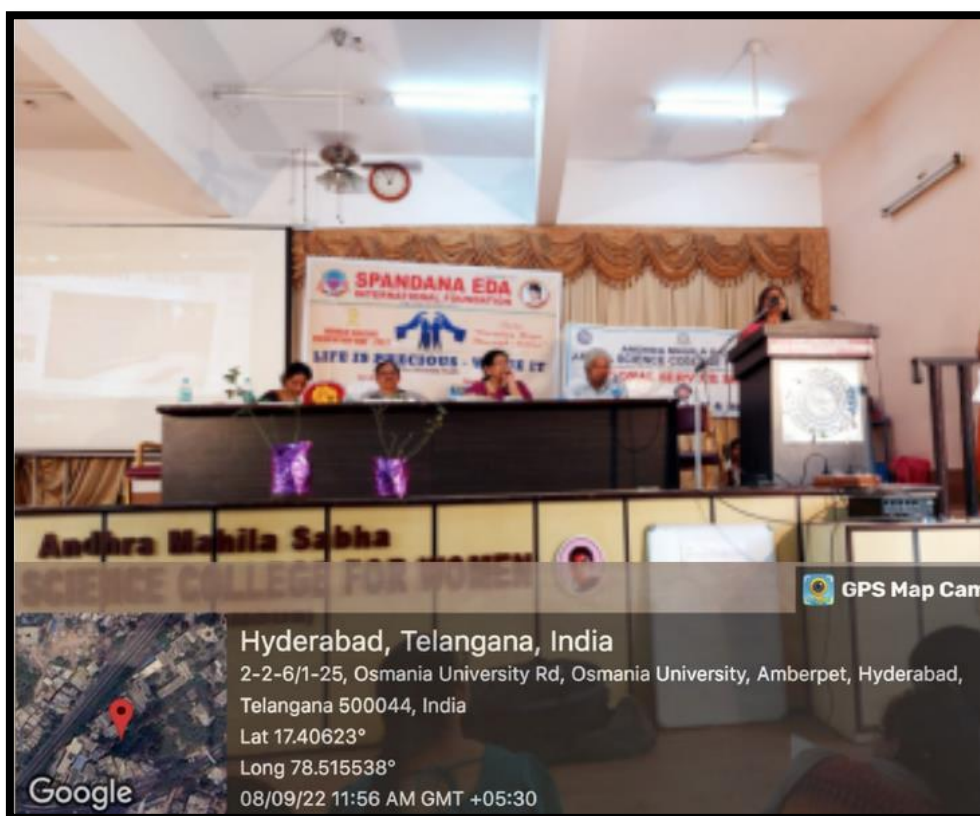

The Women’s cell of the college has conducted a lecture on “Women Equality Rights” on 25th February 2023. The resource person is **B. Vijetha, advocate.**

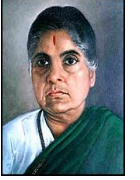
Dr. Y. Vasundhara, Convener –Women’s Cell has invited Vijetha.

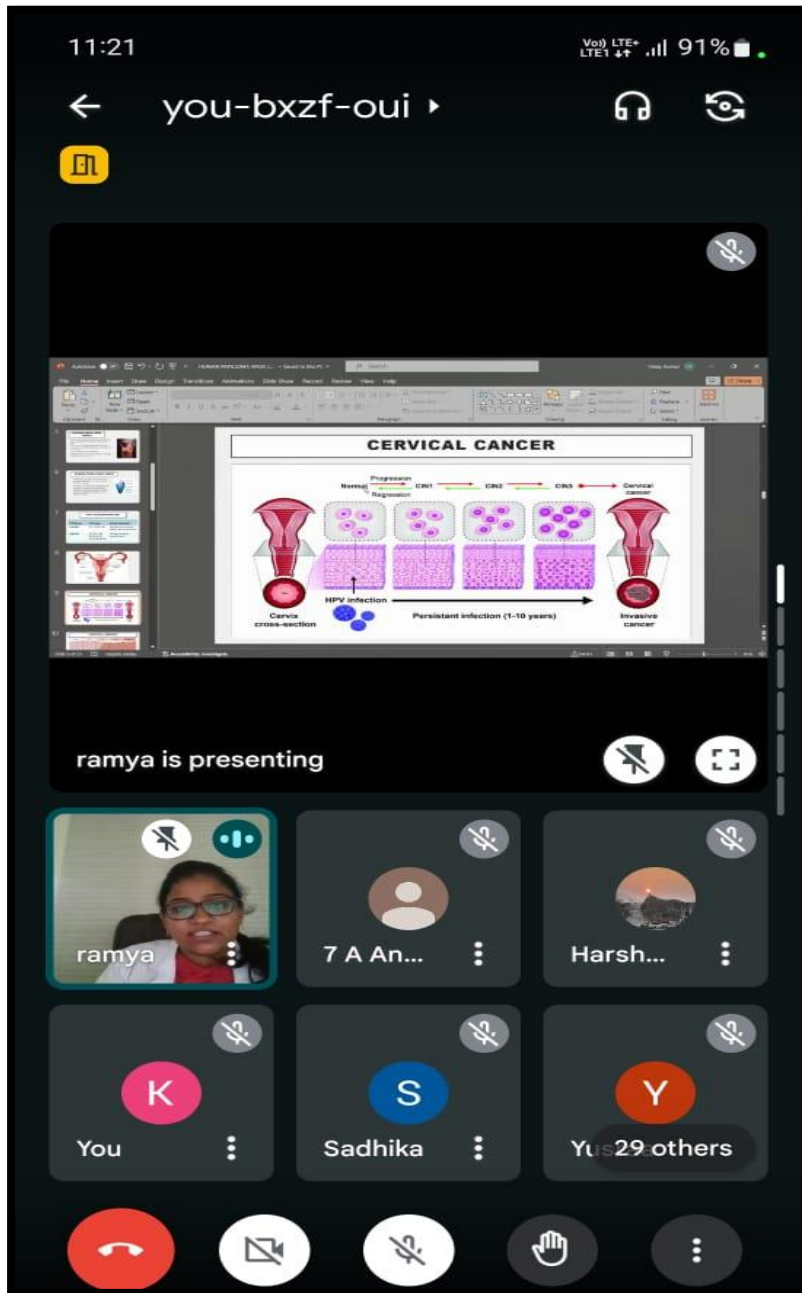

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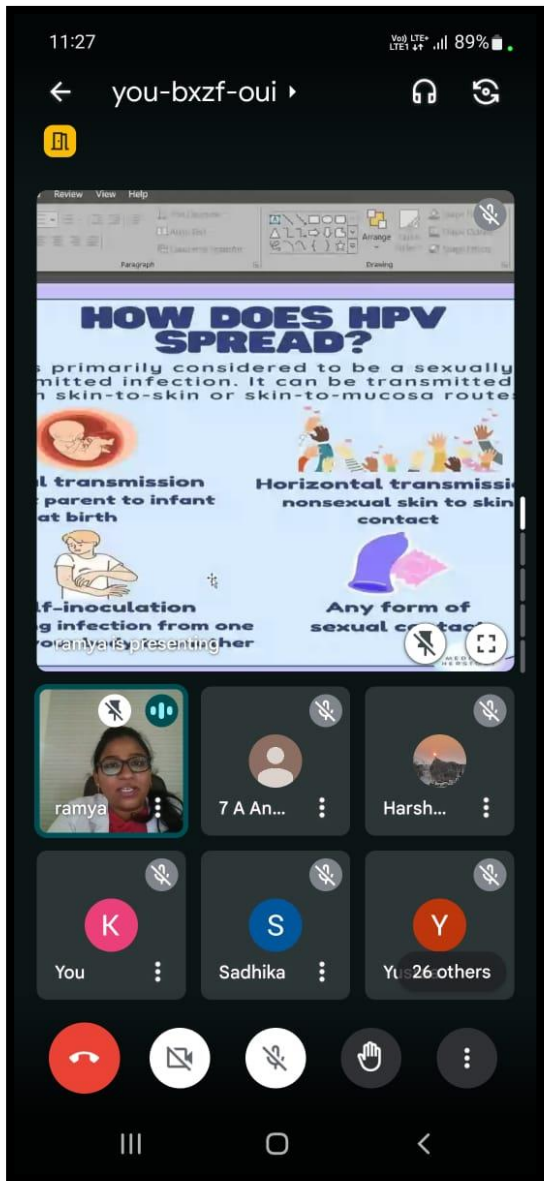


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
