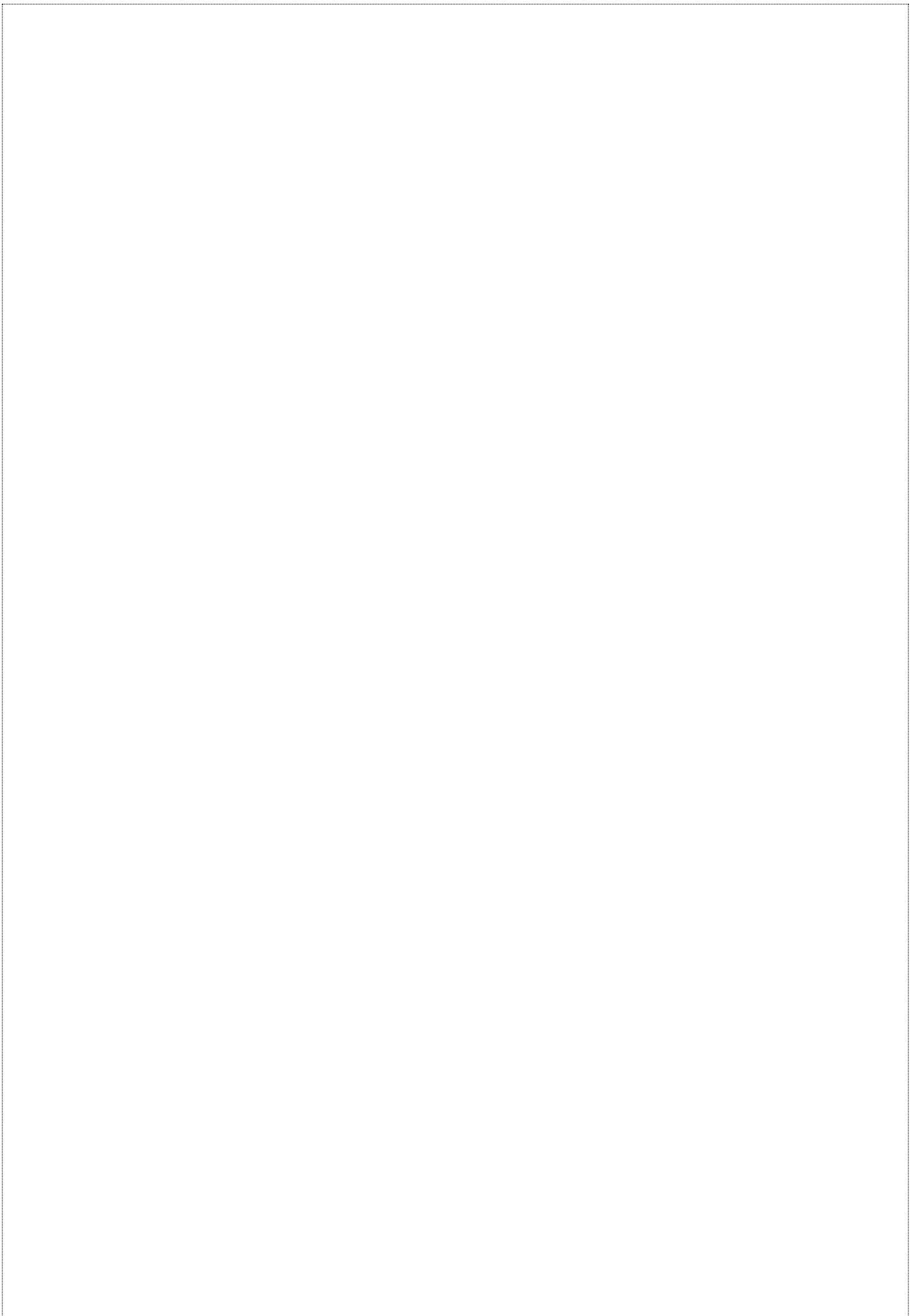



“Legal Counselling Cell - Aashraya” of Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women in collaboration with Legal Aid Clinic organized a guest lecture on “ Women Property Rights in India “ on 29 Dec, 2018 in Room No: 20 at 2:30PM. Around 45 students participated in this programme. Epsitha of B. A First Year welcomed and introduced the speaker Mrs B.Vijetha, Advocate.

She delivered a lecture on how the Governemnt has been taking a number of progressive steps to promote property holding among women in recent times. Section 14 of the Hindu Succession Act, 1956, declares, “Any property possessed by a female Hindu, whether acquired before or after the commencement of this Act, shall be held by her as full owner thereof and not as a limited owner.” The Act was amended in 2005 to give equal rights to women. This, came into effect on September 9, 2005, is applicable to the various sects and castes of Hindus, apart from Sikhs, Buddhists, and Jains. Now, a daughter becomes an owner of the coparcenary property by birth right in the same manner as a son does. Widows are also entitled to claim a share equal to that of their children at the time of distribution of the joint family property among the sons.

Schedule IX of the Indian Constitution lists the various laws beyond the scope of judicial review. This Act generally does not grant the same rights to women in inheritance as their male counterparts. In its attempt to plug the problem of defragmentation of land holdings into smaller and smaller parts, authorities have resorted to this remedy. So, in most agrarian states, women don't inherit agricultural land holdings. To better empower the women of the country, the government will have to plug such holes in the system.






