A Report on Constitution Day Celebrations 2025

The Department of Political Science celebrated Constitution Day on 26th November 2025 at 11:00 a.m. in M.V. Hall. Students from various academic streams participated enthusiastically, reflecting unity and respect for the Indian Constitution.

The programme began with anchoring by Meghana, B.A (EPP) III-year student, who warmly welcomed the gathering. She invited the Chief Guest, the Principal, the Vice Principal, and the IQAC Coordinator onto the stage. The event commenced with everyone reciting the Preamble of the Indian Constitution, creating a profound sense of pride and togetherness.

The Principal, Dr. K. Karuna Devi, addressed the students and highlighted the greatness of the Constitution. She encouraged them to gain deep knowledge of constitutional values and understand their relevance in everyday life. The Chief Guest delivered an insightful and informative address, covering the historical background and evolution of the Constitution. The Principal of the college appreciated their creativity, awareness, and enthusiastic participation.


