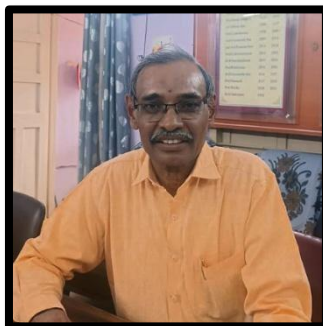

## ANNUAL REPORT

I feel extremely happy and honoured to present the **College Annual Report and Sports Report for the academic year 2025–2026**.

At the outset, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to our **President Madam, Smt. Usha Kanda; Vice President, Smt. Lakshmi Sundari Madam; General Secretary, Dr. Lalitha Kameswari Madam; Chairman, Sri D. Chakrapani Sir; and our Honourable Secretary and Correspondent, Sri Ch. V. Sai Prasad**, for their constant encouragement, guidance, and support in all the activities undertaken by the institution during this academic year.

I am delighted to announce that our college has received an **extension of Autonomous Status for another five years, from 2025 to 2030**, granted on **11th March 2026**. It is a matter of great pride that this extension was approved **without a physical inspection**, which clearly reflects the credibility, academic standards, and quality maintained by our institution. I congratulate the entire team for their dedicated efforts in achieving this significant milestone.

I am also pleased to share that **Degree admissions through DOST** have been highly successful this year. Our college filled **620 seats**, compared to **568 seats last year**, showing a commendable increase in student enrolment.

With the implementation of **automation and an online fee payment system**, we successfully collected **65% of the fees from first-year students through online mode**, marking a significant step towards **digital financial management and transparency**.

In recognition of the dedicated efforts of the team, the management sanctioned an **incentive of ₹1,30,000 to the DOST team** for their commendable performance. Additionally, **₹56,000 was awarded as incentives to the best performers among the teaching and non-teaching staff**, appreciating their commitment and service to the institution.

### **Academic Results (2024–2025)**

The college achieved encouraging academic results during the academic year **2024–2025**, reflecting the dedication and hard work of both faculty and students.

#### **Undergraduate Results**

- **B.A.** – 87%
- **B.Com.** – 92%
- **B.Sc.** – 86%
- **BBA** – 97%

#### **Postgraduate Results**

- **M.A.** – 88%
- **M.Com.** – 89%
- **M.Sc. Chemistry** – 57%
- **M.Sc. Mathematics with Computers** – 47%

These results demonstrate the institution's commitment to maintaining **high academic standards and supporting student success.**

## **Best Practices of the Academic Year**

### **1. Newspaper Reading Initiative**

Introduced by our Chairman, this initiative encourages faculty and students to develop the habit of reading newspapers regularly. Faculty members share brief summaries of important news articles daily in the college WhatsApp group, enhancing awareness of current affairs and broadening knowledge across various fields.

### **2. Library Extension Hours**

To support students in their academic preparation, the library working hours were extended from **5:00 PM to 6:30 PM**. This initiative is particularly beneficial for **hostel students**, especially girls, enabling them to effectively utilize library resources.

### **3. Civil Services Coaching**

The college provides **free Civil Services coaching** to interested students preparing for competitive examinations. Classes are conducted by the aided faculty of the institution.

### **4. Entrepreneurship Leadership Development Programme (ELDP)**

A total of **360 students in five batches** enrolled in the **Entrepreneurship Leadership Development Programme** the classes were given by IIM Lucknow, IIT Dhandad, IIT Patna, this program is sponsored by Mr.Day Veerlapati, CEO, S2 Tech. This is aimed at nurturing leadership and entrepreneurial skills among students.

### **5. Mock Assembly and Youth Mental Health Training**

The Department of Political Science conducted a **Mock Assembly Programme** in collaboration with the **Aditya Birla Educational Trust** and organized a **Youth Mental Health First Aid Training Programme**, in which **25 students were trained as ambassadors** to conduct awareness activities in the college.

### **6. Medical Camps**

Two **medical camps** were organized for students and staff. Many students were found to be anaemic, and awareness lectures were arranged to educate them about health and nutrition.

We sincerely acknowledge the following contributors:

The total amount of donations received is ₹3,17,995.

### **7. Training Sessions on Artificial Intelligence and Robotics**

Training sessions on **AI and Robotics** were conducted to introduce students to emerging technologies. A total of **93 students participated**, gaining knowledge about AI applications and technological advancements.

### **8. Certificate Course in Mushroom Cultivation**

The **Department of Botany** introduced a **Certificate Course in Mushroom Cultivation**, providing students with skill-based training and encouraging **self-employment opportunities**.

### **MSME Entrepreneurship Awareness Programme**

An **Entrepreneurship Awareness Programme** was organized in collaboration with the **Central Institute of Tool Design**. Around **300 students participated**, gaining insights into entrepreneurship, government support schemes, innovation, and self-employment opportunities.

### **Placement Cell Activities**

The **Placement Cell** has been actively working to enhance the employability skills of students.

- **21 students** have been shortlisted for placements during the academic year **2025–2026**.
- **12 students** secured internships with a stipend of **₹17,000 per month**.
- **Two companies** visited the campus for recruitment.
- The Placement Cell organized **18 placement-related activities**, including campus drives, field visits, and guest lectures.

Under the **Skill Development Programme**, the following certificate courses were conducted:

- **BFSI Programme (AISCET)** – 60 students
- **Medical Coding** – 61 students

- **Data Analytics** – 160 students

Additionally, **14 students completed internships through Inter Vision Internships**, gaining valuable professional exposure.

Awareness programmes on **higher education, overseas studies, and career opportunities** were also conducted to guide students in planning their future careers. A **DEET Awareness Programme** was organized to help students understand employment opportunities through digital employment platforms.

### **Earn While You Learn – Internship Opportunities**

The college actively promotes the **Earn While You Learn initiative**, encouraging students to gain practical experience while earning a stipend.

- **18 final-year BBA Healthcare students** are undergoing apprenticeships in reputed hospitals in Hyderabad with a **monthly stipend of ₹10,000**.
- **15 English Department students** completed a **15-day internship**, receiving a **stipend of ₹8,000 each**.
- **10 Botany students** completed internships under the **MARI–WOW initiative**, receiving **₹5,000 each**.

These initiatives help students gain **industry exposure, practical skills, and professional confidence**.

### **Department of Physical Education – Annual Sports Report (2025–2026)**

The **Department of Physical Education**, under the leadership of **Prof. M. Sridevi**, has actively promoted sports and fitness among students.

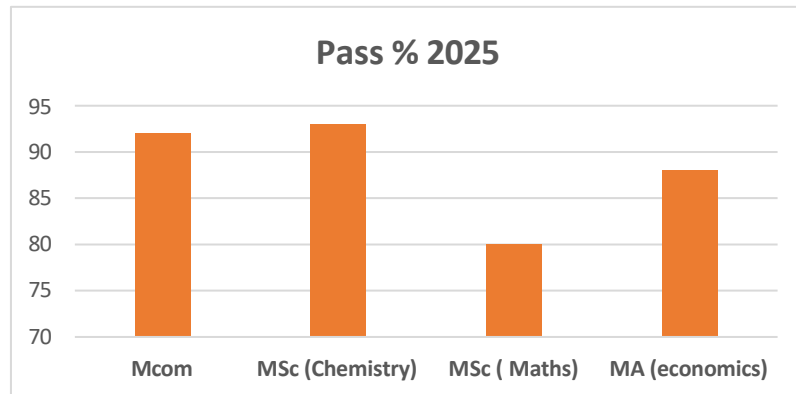

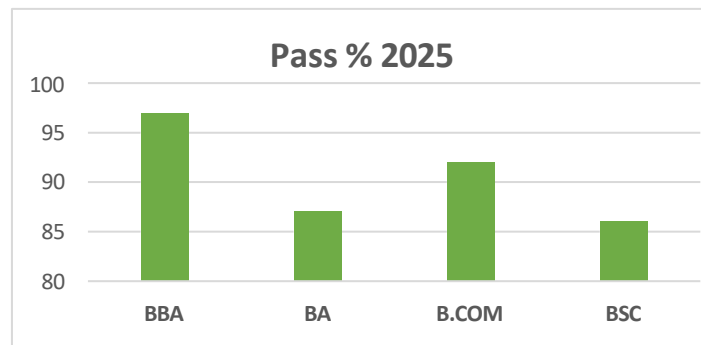

# INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

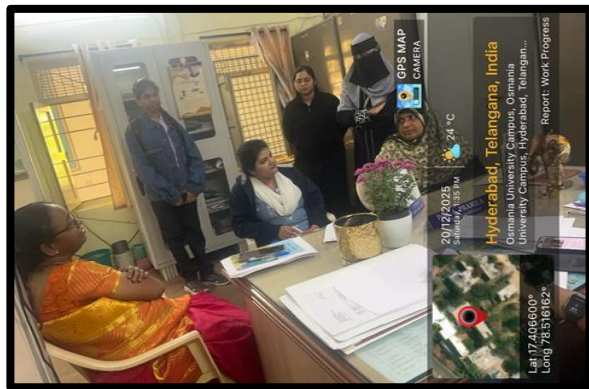
## REPORT

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women conducted various activities during the academic year 2025–2026 to strengthen academic quality and institutional development. Regular internal meetings and IQAC committee meetings were organized to review quality initiatives, monitor documentation, and ensure the timely preparation and submission of AQAR to the National Assessment and Accreditation Council. Convenors were guided on proper evidence collection, data validation, and documentation practices required for accreditation. The meeting helped strengthen coordination among departments and ensured the systematic implementation of internal quality assurance mechanisms.

The IQAC organized Faculty Development Programmes on Bloom’s Taxonomy and Indian Knowledge System (IKS) to enhance outcome-based education and integrate traditional knowledge into teaching. The FDP enabled faculty members to design effective learning outcomes, adopt appropriate teaching methodologies, and develop evaluation tools covering cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains. Faculty members were oriented on incorporating IKS elements into curriculum delivery and interdisciplinary teaching. Student-focused initiatives such as an Induction Programme and a Parent–Teacher Meeting were conducted to support student orientation and improve stakeholder engagement.

Quality assurance practices such as question paper moderation based on Bloom’s Taxonomy, verification of CO–PO–PSO alignment, and the implementation of the Maturity Based Graded Level (MBGL) system were undertaken. The meeting ensured that all departments followed the required academic framework and documentation standards. The 40th IQAC meeting was held on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2025. Discussions were held on institutional activities such as FDPs, field visits, Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs), placements, and best practices adopted by various departments. In addition, an Academic Audit and a lecture on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) were organized to strengthen academic standards and promote awareness about research and innovation. The audit committee reviewed departmental records, lesson plans, CO–PO mapping, and student performance data. The findings of the audit helped identify institutional strengths and areas requiring improvement. The lecture created awareness among faculty and students about patents, trademarks, copyrights, and the importance of protecting research innovations.

Through these activities, the IQAC significantly contributed to strengthening academic standards, improving faculty development, enhancing student support systems, and promoting a culture of continuous quality improvement within the institution.

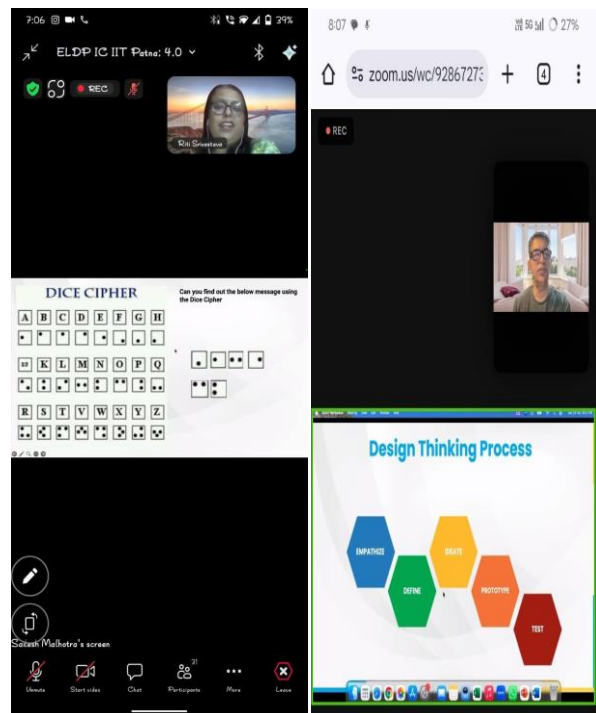
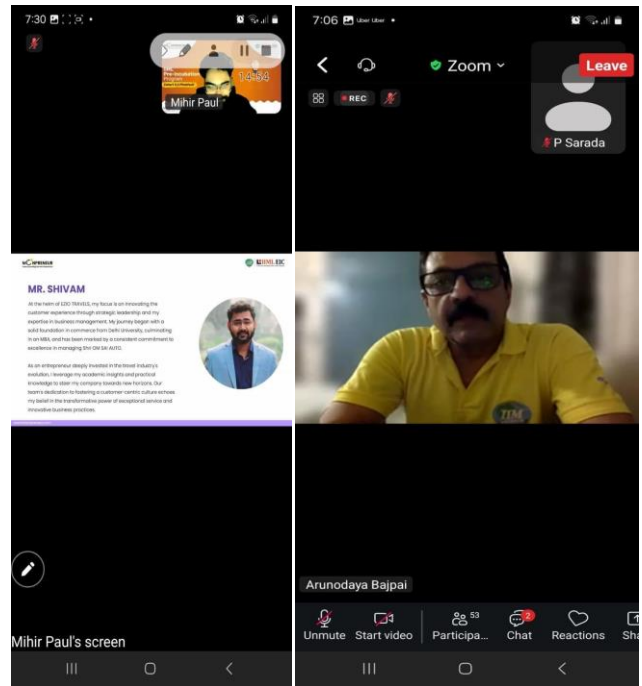
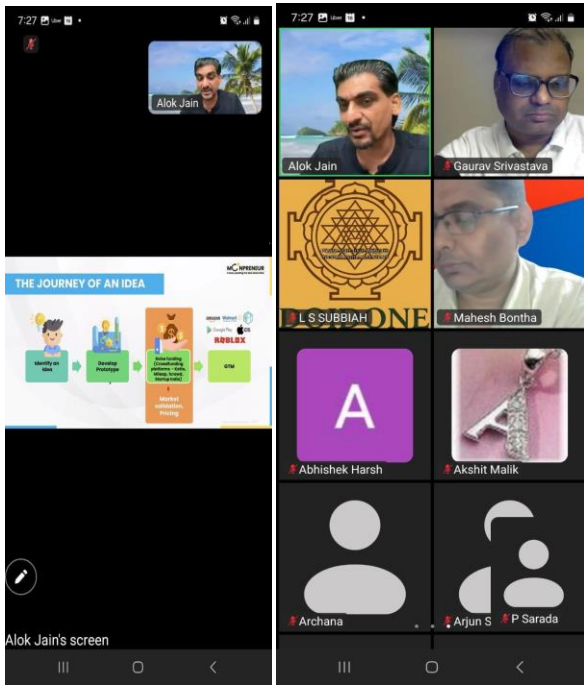
## Entrepreneur Leadership Development Program (ELDP) REPORT

## NATIONAL SEMINAR

### National Seminar Organised by Department of Economics and Commerce On

#### **“Public Finance in India: The 16th Finance Commission and Union Budget – An Economic Perspective”**

The Department of Economics and Commerce organized a National Seminar on **“Public Finance in India: The 16th Finance Commission and Union Budget – An Economic Perspective”** with the objective of critically examining India’s fiscal architecture, the evolving framework of fiscal federalism, and the economic implications of the Union Budget in the contemporary scenario.

#### **Inaugural Session**

The seminar was inaugurated in the presence of eminent economists and academicians. The Chief Guest and Keynote Speaker, **Sri. G. R. Reddy**, (Retd.) G. R. Reddy, former officer of the Indian Economic Services, delivered the keynote address on **“Evolution of Fiscal Federalism in India and Finance Commission – Special Reference to the 16th Finance Commission.”**

In his address, he explained the constitutional provisions under Articles 268–281 that govern Centre–State financial relations. He elaborated on the critical role of the Finance Commission of India in recommending the vertical and horizontal devolution of taxes. He traced the historical evolution from the First Finance Commission (1951) to the emerging priorities of the 16th Finance Commission, emphasizing fiscal consolidation, revenue deficit grants, performance-based incentives, and strengthening cooperative federalism.

#### **He also discussed contemporary challenges such as:**

- Rising fiscal deficits
- Increasing public debt
- GST compensation issues
- Need for balanced regional development
- Enhancing states’ fiscal autonomy

His session provided deep insights into how fiscal federalism shapes economic stability and inclusive growth in India.

#### **Guest of Honor Address**

The Guest of Honor, **Prof. S. V. Satyanarayana**, (Retd.), Department of Commerce, Osmania University, presented a comprehensive lecture on **“Overview on Finance & Budget.”**

He explained:

- Principles of public finance
- Revenue sources (tax and non-tax revenue)
- Public expenditure classification
- Budgetary process in India
- Role of fiscal policy in economic development

He emphasized the importance of responsible budgeting, transparency, and accountability in public financial management. His lecture helped students understand the theoretical and practical dimensions of finance and budgeting.

### **Technical Session**

The technical session was delivered by **Dr. Krishna Reddy Chittedi**, Associate Professor at the School of Economics, University of Hyderabad. His talk on “**Union Budget – An Economic Perspective**” focused on analyzing the Union Budget in terms of macroeconomic stability and growth.

#### **Key highlights of his session included:**

- Fiscal deficit trends and FRBM targets
- Capital expenditure and infrastructure push
- Sectoral allocations (health, education, agriculture, MSMEs)
- Impact of budgetary measures on inflation and employment
- Role of public investment in stimulating economic growth

He critically examined how budgetary policies influence economic development, private investment, and long-term fiscal sustainability.

The speakers addressed the queries with analytical clarity, encouraging critical thinking among students and faculty members.

During the National Seminar on “Public Finance in India: The 16th Finance Commission and Union Budget – An Economic Perspective, the faculty and students actively participated by delivering insightful PowerPoint presentations. The presentations highlighted key aspects of fiscal policy, center–State financial relations, taxation reforms, and budgetary allocations under the 16th Finance Commission. Faculty members provided analytical perspectives and academic insights, while students contributed through data-driven analysis, case studies, and recent budget statistics. The interactive session reflected thorough research, critical thinking, and collaborative learning, making the seminar intellectually enriching and academically significant for all participants.

# **DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY**

## **Activities from January 2025 to December 2025**

### **1. Live Experiment on Groupthink, Instinct, and the Bystander Effect**

The Department of Psychology conducted a live experiment on Groupthink, Instinctual Responses, and the Bystander Effect on 29 January 2025 at the college campus. A spontaneous group dance was initiated to observe real-time social reactions in a natural setting. Observers recorded how passersby responded, focusing on conformity, immediate instinctive reactions, and willingness to participate. The findings indicated a strong presence of the bystander effect, as most individuals chose to observe rather than engage. Instinctive reactions included curiosity and hesitation, while groupthink influence remained minimal. The activity enhanced experiential learning and helped students understand social psychological concepts in a practical context.

### **2. Mental Awareness Program**

The Department of Psychology organized a Mental Awareness Program on 28 July 2025 to promote emotional well-being and reduce stigma surrounding mental health. The program included welcome addresses, informative speeches, a presentation on social media's impact on mental health, and a student skit titled "The Unseen Battle." Speakers emphasized the importance of early intervention, open conversations, and digital mindfulness. The event addressed issues such as suicidal thoughts, psychological distress, and the influence of online platforms on youth. The program successfully encouraged awareness, compassion, and responsibility among students and faculty, contributing to a more supportive and inclusive campus environment.

### **3. Inauguration of Psychology Laboratory**

On 16 October 2025, the Department of Psychology inaugurated its newly established Psychology Laboratory at the college campus. The laboratory was created to enhance academic and research facilities within the department. Equipped to facilitate psychological assessments, experiments, and practical training, it aims to strengthen students' hands-on learning experiences. The inauguration marked a significant step in advancing academic infrastructure and supporting experiential education in psychology. Faculty members and administrators attended the formal event. The establishment of the laboratory reflects the department's commitment to academic excellence, research development, and skill-based training, fostering deeper understanding and professional growth among psychology students.

## **Report on Youth Mental Health and First Aid (YMHFA) Training and Workshop**

Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts & Science College for Women signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Mpower – Aditya Birla Educational Trust on 25th June 2025. On the same day, a Mental Health Club was established on campus to promote mental health awareness among students.

As part of this initiative, the Department of Political Science organized a three-day Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) Training and Workshop from 6th to 8th October 2025 in the Seminar Hall, Library Block, in collaboration with Mpower – Aditya Birla Educational Trust. Ms. D. Sahana, Mental Health Trainer from the Trust, served as the Resource Person.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. K. Karuna Devi, Principal (I/c), and coordinated by Dr. Y. Vasundhara, Vice-Principal and Programme Coordinator. The sessions were mentored by Ms. D. Sahana, Psychologist, and Mr. Nagendra, Mental Health Facilitator, Hyderabad District.

Elections were conducted and Ms. K. Lasya Priya, B.A (EPsyP) II Year, was elected as Leader, and Ms. A. Amanthika, B.A (EPsyP) II Year, as Co-Leader.

A short assessment was conducted to evaluate the learning outcomes, and all participants performed well. The programme concluded with a Vote of Thanks delivered by Ms. K. Lasya Priya.

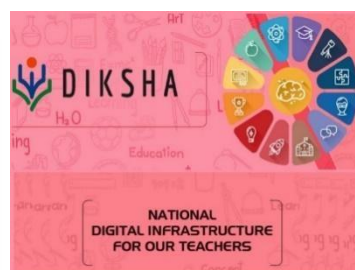
